Evaluation of the use of an intranasal metallic dilator in patients with syndrome of obstructive sleep apnea on CPAP use. Published in vol. 13 #2, 2009. *Original Article, with 5.95% of the votes in the category.*

Review Article

How cochlear implants can interfere in vestibular function? Published in vol. 13 #2, 2009. *Review Article, with 17.24% of the votes in the category.*

Case Report

Computer-assisted-endoscopic surgery of a large trigeminal schwannoma in the pterygopalatine fossa. Published in vol. 13 #4, 2009. *Case Report, with 14.29% of the category.*
